## **First Questions:**

1. From Councillor Porter to the Executive Lead Member for Children's Services:

"Why does this Council promote the view that an early start to education is beneficial and then agree to a policy for 2019 that will cut transport provision from rural areas for the rising fives?"

2. From Councillor Tod to the Executive Member for Environment and Transport:

"Following the decision to prioritise capital spending against reducing the number of people killed and seriously injured on Hampshire's roads, what proportion of people killed and seriously injured on Hampshire's roads are cyclists - and what proportion of Hampshire's capital spending on highways is on interventions designed to enable safer cycling?"

3. From Councillor Porter to the Executive Lead Member for Children's Services:

"Is the Executive Member disappointed that the Conservative Education Minister, Damien Hinds, has decided to ignore Cllr Perry, our Conservative Council Leader's advice, and he has proceeded to offer more money for grammar schools when it is clear that grammar schools do not yield better results, when more money is needed for all schools and especially for those children with special needs?"
