- Continuing across the County throughout this year
- Showing a high visibility presence near fly-tipping hotspots
- Over 600 Hundred vehicles stop checked last year
- Motoring offence FPNs issued and Vehicle seized for no tax, MOT or
- Education given to business owners who were stopped
- Well received by the public when questioned at the stop checks




ntelligence and Enforcement Working Group

- Opportunity to discuss new ideas pilot schemes





CCTV is operating in fly-tipping hotspots

Offenders face an unlimited fine, criminal record and a prison sentence.





You could face an unlimited 1. fine if your rubbish is found i fly-tipped – even if you didn't do it yourself.

You must use a licensed waste carrier to dispose of waste, or take it to a household waste recycling centre (hants.gov.uk/ recyclingcentres).

You must show you took reasonable steps to prevent your waste being fly-tipped. This is called your duty of care.

County Council

 Check if your waste carrier is licensed. You can do this quickly with their name or licence number at hants.gov.uk/fly-tipping.

 Ask what will happen to your waste. A licensed waste carrier should not object to this.

 Keep a record of their waste carrier licence number by taking a photo of the licence, or take a screenshot when you check online.

The campaign aims to reduce fly-tipping by encouraging residents to 1) check waste collectors are licensed and 2) report instances of fly-tipping

All materials have been produced inhouse, including video animations and a microsite at <u>www.hants.gov.uk/fly-tipping</u> Special themed animations have been produced for the World Cup, Christmas and Halloween

Media channels include Facebook, Twitter and Google Display advertising, poster sites, and our own read-time information displays at bus stops

To extend the reach of the campaign we have made it available to partners free of charge, including the Environment Agency, Police and Crime Commissioner, other local authorities, the National Farmers Union, and the CLA (Country Land and Business Association)

Since the launch on 22 June 2018, the digital adverts have been shown nearly 7.7m times (impressions), with over 29,000 clicks through to our website (from Facebook and Google) and 156,000 video views (from Twitter).
