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The development of Integrated Care Systems



Background / Context

- White Paper published in February 2021 regarding the legal formalisation of Integrated Care Systems. Builds on the experience of testing these ways of working since 2016 across health and local government.
- Health and Care Bill now being considered by Parliament –currently being reviewed by House of Lords prior to Report Stage and 3rd Reading in the House of Commons.
- If approved, changes will put Integrated Care Systems on a legal footing and current target date for this is July 2022, should Parliament approve the Bill and receive Royal Assent.
- ICSs will have four main objectives:
 - Improve population health and healthcare
 - Tackle unequal outcomes and access
 - Enhance productivity and value for money
 - Mutually support broader social and economic development

Integrated Care Partnership

The Integrated Care Partnership (ICP) will be a joint committee between the proposed Integrated Care Boards (ICBs), Hampshire County Council and the upper tier authorities they cover.



Purpose

Create a genuine multi-agency partnership forum for establishing a culture and function based on joint working

- a. Set the strategic intent and approve the long term strategy of the Integrated Care System
- Bring together the Health and Wellbeing strategies of our geographies
- c. Help the public sector as a whole improve the health of the population, deliver taxpayer value and contribute to economic and social improvement

Integrated Care Board

The Integrated Care Board (ICB) is the statutory organisation that allocates NHS resources, leads integration in the NHS, and has oversight of NHS delivery in the area it covers.

The proposed minimum requirements of the ICB Board are:

A chair A chief executive

- Two Non-executive members
- Executive Directors, including the core roles of Chief Finance Officer, Chief Medical Officer, Chief Nursing Officer. The Chief Executive and Chair have flexibility to add further roles.
- A Partner member from the Local Authority sector
- A Partner member from the NHS provider sector
- A Partner member from the Primary Care sector

 1st July 2022 – statutory ICSs and ICBs in place, subject to legislation being passed in Parliament.

• System partners will work through 2022 to formulate and refresh strategies in order to help the ICP meet its remit.

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
