


- The most recent national exclusion data is Autumn 21-22. HCC Autumn 21-22 is discretely compared to this across the graphs and tables.

Interventions – Now and Next

- Excellent channels of communications with schools from direct phone lines to e-mail enquiries and dedicated inboxes. Most queries are dealt with within 24 – 48 hours.
- Communications with our 'support and challenge' approach continue the successful relationship we
 have built with all Hampshire schools irrespective of their designation.
- ISS works effectively within Children Services, liaising, supporting meetings and conversations to promote inclusion and provide solutions for our most vulnerable children.
- Patterns of exclusion and rising profiles and numbers are shared with partner agencies so that we
 can all join together to reduce exclusions and days lost to education for young people.
- Countywide exclusion data is shared with all parties including schools in order to identify concerns and address trends.
- ISS shares information and issues around exclusion when delivering presentations and training to many stakeholders.





The Future

- If the current trends of increased permanent exclusion remain serious thought needs to be given to how we can incentivise inclusion over exclusion.
- There is a need to build more resilience in schools and look at proactive rather than reactive measures
 around challenging behaviour. This involves looking at schools' individual and joint resources creating
 in house alternative provision to engage and meet the needs of children.
- Transformation needs to be around how schools can be more inclusive to meet the needs of the children now and in the future.

The big question: How can schools be supported to be thriving centres of inclusive excellence for all our Hampshire children?
