Through our work we will ensure that:

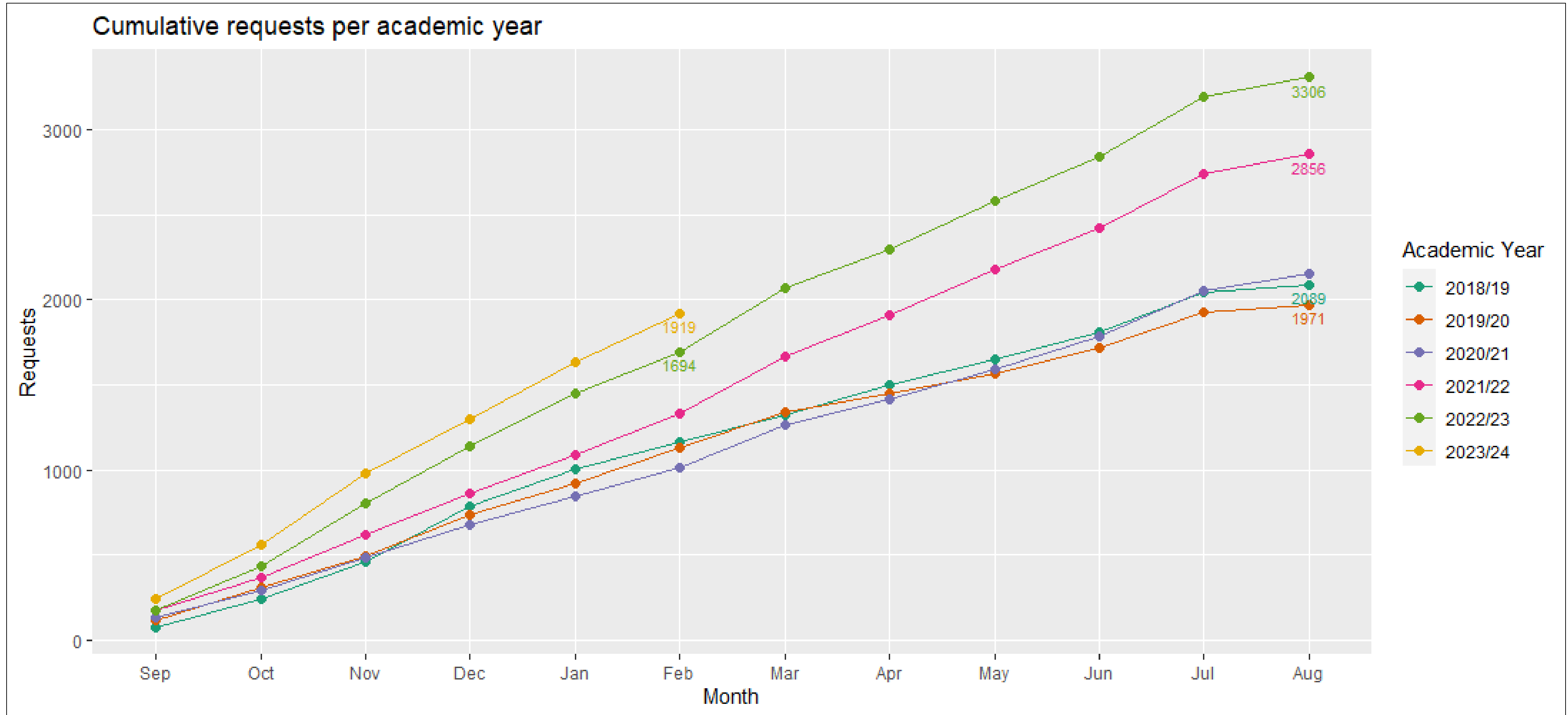
- Children's Special Educational Needs are picked up early and effective support is put into place quickly during the life or a problem or need.
- Staff have the knowledge, understanding and skills to provide the right support for children and young people who have SEN or are disabled.
- Parents and young people know what they can reasonably expect their local

school, college, Local Authority and local services to provide, without having to fight for it.

- There is sufficient and flexible provision to meet need.
- Aspirations for children and young people are raised through an increased focus on life outcomes including education, health and care.
- Children, young people and parents co-produce the provision for children and are engaged in the co-production of strategy.

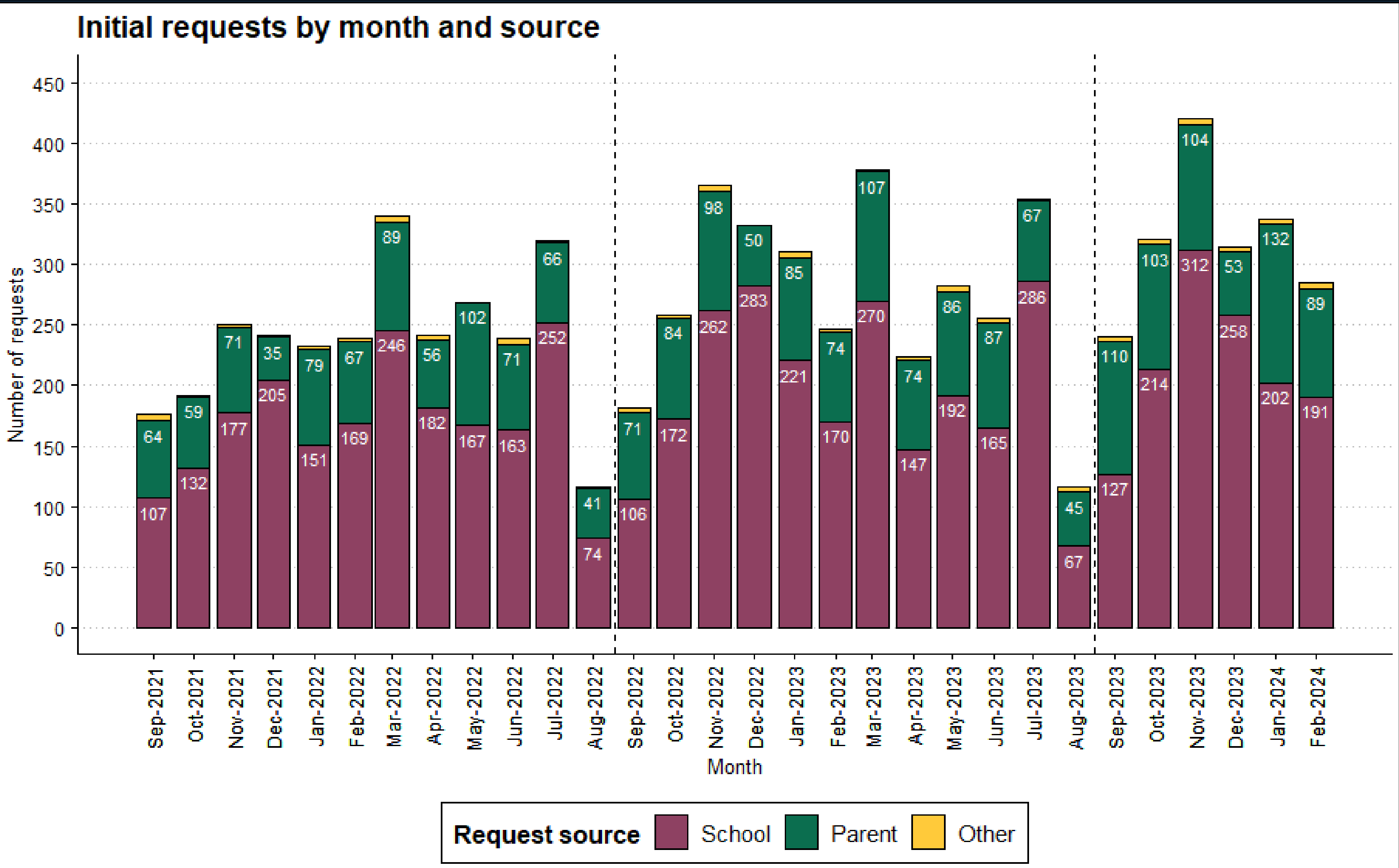

# Monitoring Demand – Academic Year



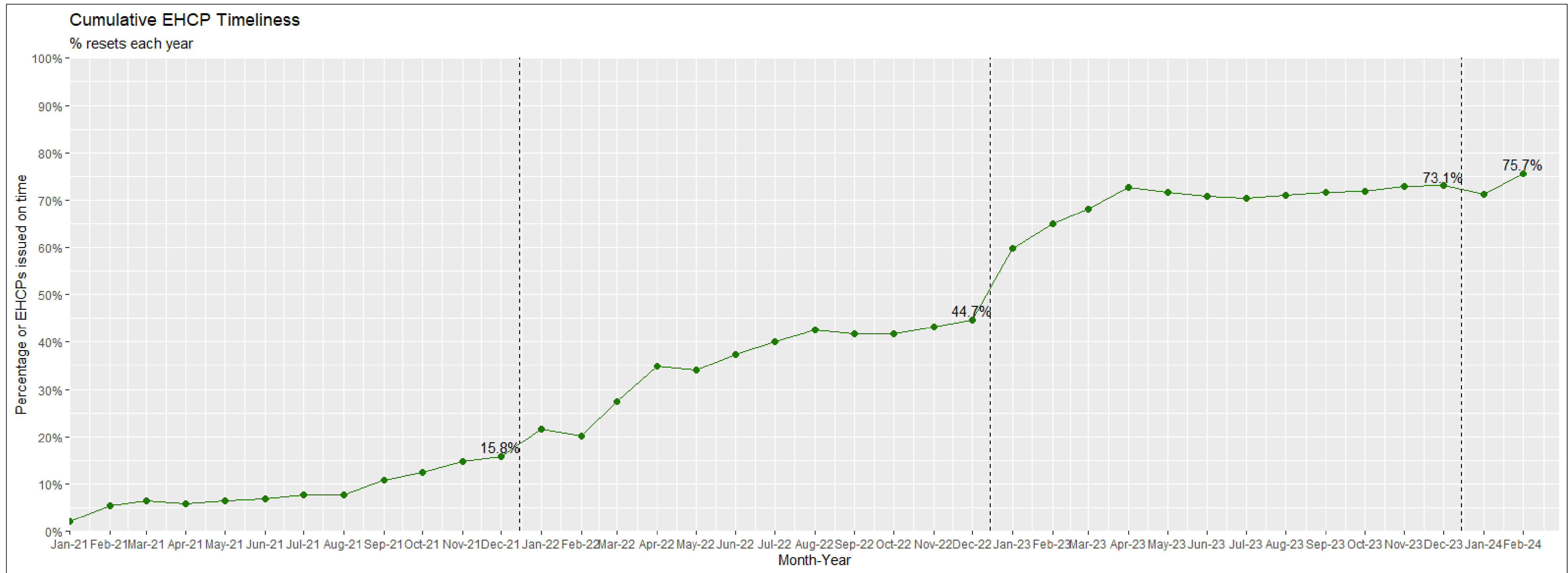
The trend of increasing demand has continued this academic year, with 225 more requests received between September and February than the previous academic year.
