

Addendum to Agenda Item 6 of the Meeting of the River Hamble Harbour Board on Friday 1 April 2022

- 9.60. 08 Mar. Fitting of new handrails to the re-furbished River Hamble Country Park Jetty. Assistance to Hampshire Marine Police Unit in a search for a missing person.
- 9.61. 09 Mar. Completed fitting of new handrails to the refurbished River Hamble Country Park Jetty.
- 9.62. 10 Mar. Patrol craft maintenance. Port Waste Management Plan inspection preparations. Assistance given to a yacht displaced by the routine Crown Estate pile replacement programme.
- 9.63. 11 Mar. Inspection of a mid-stream mooring with a parted chain link. Liaison with the owner and the Crown Estate mooring contractor to effect repair. Boat coding work.
- 9.64. 12 Mar. Liaison with Hampshire Police and Hampshire Marine Police Unit regarding the previously reported missing person throughout the day. Air, shore and marine assets deployed. At 1600, Patrol responded to a request from Hampshire Police to assist in the recovery of the body of a male from Lincegrove and Hacketts' Marshes. Patrol recovered the body at the request of the Police for forensic examination. The body was identified as that of the reported missing person.
- 9.65. 13 Mar. Slipway clearance at Warsash. Movement of a yacht to accommodate chain repair work.
- 9.66. 14 Mar. Nothing significant to report.
- 9.67. 15 Mar. Maintenance of Hamble Point Sector Light. Preparation for programmed dredge of a Marina. Liaison with HM Coast Guard and assistance given to a yacht aground outside the River on Hamble Spit.
- 9.68. 16 Mar. Nothing significant to report.
- 9.69. 17 Mar. Nothing significant to report.
- 9.70. 18 Mar. Boat coding work. Sourcing of failed parts to repair Hamble Point Sector Light and replacement decking for Warsash Hammerhead.
- 9.71. 19 Mar. Assistance given to a yacht leaving the 'B' pontoon in strong winds. Support given to a motor vessel with engine failure. Tow from a vacant mid-stream mooring to her berth at a sailing club for defect rectification.
- 9.72. 20 Mar. Escort of a motor vessel reporting intermittent propulsion failure from the mouth of the River to her marina berth. Commercial tow of a motor vessel from the mouth of the River to Warsash Jetty. The vessel had run out of fuel.
- 9.73. 21 Mar. Support to scaffolding operation at Warsash Jetty. Preparations for fitting of new pipework for the replacement sewage pump-out facility.

- 9.74. 22 Mar. Support to the Crown Estate pile replacement programme.
- 9.75. 23 Mar. First Aid equipment check. Re-charge of Oxygen cylinder. Recovered a large log from the Main Channel adjacent to the Chinese Bridge. Patrol craft anti-foul checks.
- 9.76. 24 Mar. Nothing significant to report.
- 9.77. 25 Mar. Installation of replacement 'mesh type' jetty surface at Warsash. Support to scaffolding work at Warsash. Support given to a visiting motor vessel with propulsion failure temporarily alongside a club jetty. Responded to a call from a member of the public reporting an abandoned tender on private property at Bursledon. Further report from the landowner received regarding an outboard engine, apparently hidden for subsequent collection on his property. Liaison with Hampshire Marine Police Unit to achieve recovery. Engine serial number traced to the owner of a vessel in an adjacent marina. Engine and tender stolen.
- 9.78. 26 Mar. First Aid equipment checks. Patrol stopped and warned two jet skis for excessive speed and wash near Swanwick slipway. Both issued with written warnings.
- 9.79. 27 Mar. Recovery of a paddleboarder who had fallen from her board between Crableck and Swanwick. Paddleboarder recovered to a marina. Further decking replacement work at Warsash.
- 9.80. 28 Mar. Liaison with the Crown Estate mooring contractor. Attended a marina to investigate a vessel of interest. Attended a marina in response to reports of a diesel fuel spillage. A small amount located and broken up with propeller wash. No obvious source identified.
- 9.81. 29 Mar. Interviews for seasonal patrol coxswains. Further decking replacement work at Warsash.
